Crossroads Caring for Carers, established in 1987, provides a wide range of community care services across Sandwell, Birmingham, Walsall, Wolverhampton and surrounding areas. We are an affiliated member of the Carers Trust since 2012 and registered with the Care Quality Commission (CQC), rated as a 'Good' provider.

We help informal carers to care for longer by providing practical support, training, respite and palliative care, improving the health and wellbeing of carers and those they care for. We also run the Carers Assistance line which provides for advice, guidance and support for carers in Sandwell.

In addition, we offer personal care to support with daily living needs, enabling people with complex needs to remain in their own home for longer. This can be provided alongside social care services or funded by the person themselves or their family.

Our vision and mission is to support family carers to enable their loved one to remain in their own home for as long as possible. We provide highly trained qualified staff who deliver flexible person-centred care to both the carer and the person they care for.

We also provide services for informal carers of people with memory issues or a dementia diagnosis. In Sandwell, we have the Dementia Care Navigator team who can offer advice and support to carers and the cared for at all stages of the dementia journey and in Birmingham we have Carer Support Groups, giving carers the opportunity to meet others in a similar situation to themselves, get support and share information. In Birmingham, we also provide training to help carers in their caring role.

SAFS (formally known as Sandwell Asian Family Support Service) provides a number of health, social care and well-being services to children, young people, adults with disabilities and people with complex health needs and life-limiting conditions. Our services include Domiciliary Care for children and adults, a Lifestyles Service for young adults, support services for Parent and Carers as well as day trips and events for families. SAFS works predominantly within the South Asian Community but also supports other BAME communities, ensuring all cultural, religious and linguistic needs are met. In 2016, we acquired the Windmill Community Centre, the home of many of our services alongside numerous community organisations.

Our services are categorised as:

Domiciliary Care – We support children, young people and adults in their own home by providing help with every-day things such as personal care, dressing and eating.

Lifestyles Drop-in Service – SAFS manage the SAFS Windmill Community Centre where groups and activities take place. We provide one to one support to individuals allowing them to access activities as they choose.

Community Based Service – We support children, young people and adults to access services and activities in the local community. Personal Assistant (PA) Service – This service supports individuals to access local services and activities.

Parents and Carers Service – We provide support to parents and carers on an individual basis and through group activities.

Short Breaks Offer – We design and hold holiday clubs and activities for children.

Sensory Offer – SAFS has worked hard to identify and design multi-sensory facilities at the SAFS Windmill Community Centre that can be accessed by any of service users. Our sensory offer includes an interactive sensory garden and sensory rooms.
